Being Creative With Google Classroom

<u>Format:</u> This course runs asynchronously on Google Classroom. There is an optional 45-minute intro on Meet to open the course.

<u>Goal</u>: Participants will learn how to turn their classrooms into artist workshops, while creating their own poetry, prose, and visual art of all styles, techniques, and genres.

No experience necessary! Any student/teacher can be coached to write and make art -- and everybody should have the opportunity for meaningful self-expression.

<u>Description</u>: This course teaches participants how to integrate *creativity* into their hybrid teaching practice. It will expand their toolbox of techniques, strategies, and philosophies while inspiring them to create authentic writing and original artwork.

Enrollees will be keeping notebooks, creating colorful visual art, reading their own books, reflecting on their lives, and experiencing an artist workshop for the on-line era. They will have thoroughly educational and inspirational experiences -- as both teachers and students.

<u>Instructor:</u> I have been teaching English at Great Neck South High School for over 20 years and have carved a niche with my Creativity Workshop. This approach to improving literacy is rooted in the National Writing Project, reading/writing workshop, Nancie Atwell, Linda Reif, Penny Kittle, etc. -- with a heavy dose of Tony Buzan's mind-mapping, colorful visual creations, and the artist workshop environment.
