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Course Description:

According to Robert Stakes, "When the cook tastes the soup, that's formative. When the guests taste the soup, that's summative." How do we fully integrate assessment into our instruction so that students know where they are in their learning and where they need to go next? As we plan our lessons, let's carve out more space for our students in the formative assessment cycle. Drawing on the work of feedback and formative assessment thought leaders such as Susan Brookhart, Myron Dueck, Catlin Tucker, John Spencer, and John Hattie, participants will update their formative assessment toolboxes with smarter, useful, more efficient ways to leverage feedback and engage students in the formative learning cycle...while the soup (and the learning) is still hot.

Throughout our four days together, we will immerse ourselves in current best practice designed to elevate, inspire, and facilitate more intentional assessment practices, shifting some ownership to students so that they become a greater part of the formative assessment cycle. With current research guiding our exploration, participants will enjoy a carefully-curated, high-impact playlist of engaging articles, blogs, podcasts, videos,

and practical, adaptable resources. The goal of this inspirational and informational course is for participants to start the new school year with a toolbox of formative assessment strategies, revised lesson plans and materials, and an enhanced approach to fostering a student-centered classroom brimming with effective formative assessment practices. Learning Objectives and Outcomes

Participants will:

- increase their students' ownership of learning and growth by examining multi-media resources and research focused on empowering students to set high expectations and applying this research to current grading practices
- 2. understand and apply formative assessment strategies by redesigning a lesson to include multiple formative assessment opportunities, such as self-assessment check-ins, peer feedback, and teacher feedback during the lesson.
- implement station rotation and blended learning models by designing a station rotation lesson that prioritizes student autonomy, collaboration, and continuous feedback.
- 4. analyze and reflect on the role of feedback in reducing learning gaps through thoughtful and lively discussion posts.
- 5. contribute to a class-curated toolbox of formative assessment strategies.
- 6. reflect on the course content and create an actionable plan for integrating student-driven assessment practices into everyday instruction, specifying how their practice has shifted to a more student-driven learning environment.

Assignments will be due each evening and will include written reflections, digital posts and interactive discussions, and revised lesson plans, rubrics, checklists, and activities. There is no required text: all articles, videos, podcasts, blogs, resources, and all materials will be linked in our Canvas Modules.
